Business/Non-Instructional Operations

Concept and Roles in Business and Non-Instructional Operations

The CREC Council recognizes strong financial management comprises the foundation of the many educational programs offered and shall work with the various federal and state agencies, private funding organizations, towns and elected officials to provide adequate appropriations in support of these programs. To make that support as effective as possible, the CREC Council shall:

- 1. Encourage advance planning through the best possible budget procedures.
- 2. Develop long-range education and financial plans to provide appropriate programs for students and members within the community's ability to pay.
- 3. Explore all practical sources of revenue.
- 4. Guide the expenditure of funds in a prudent manner so as to extract the greatest returns.
- 5. Follow generally accepted accounting principles and reporting procedures.
- 6. Work cooperatively with other federal, state, town and other officials.

The operation and maintenance of all facilities and equipment shall set high standards of safety, promoting the health of students, members and staff, reflect prudent management of available resources, and to support the staffs' efforts to meet the educational needs of children and adults within the Capitol Region.
