Participation Requirements and Statement of Understanding

The program dates and format for 2011 are as follows. The days for meeting are Monday through Friday of each week starting Tuesday July 5th and ending Friday July 29th. The program will be based at New Britain High School. Students will be required to arrive at NBHS by 8:30 a.m. Busses from outside districts will be provided if there is sufficient interest. Participants will return by 2:30 p.m. daily. Participants need to bring lunches, snacks, and drinks each day. A water bottle is especially important whenever the participant is involved in field studies. Extra clothing including rain gear may be necessary depending on weather conditions. Toilet facilities may be limited at the various field sites.

The Summer Program involves outdoor activities that may at times be vigorous, requiring normal good health. Participants need to be cooperative and responsible at all times to help ensure a safe and enjoyable environment for all. Access to emergency communication will be provided through cell phones and two-way radios. Simple first aid kits will be available at all sites.

State certified teachers will lead and instruct the sessions. Students from each of the participating districts (Berlin, Bristol, Farmington, Hartford, New Britain, Newington, Rocky Hill, Southington, and West Hartford) will be selected to participate. Students must attend at least 3 weeks of the program. If applicants outnumber openings, acceptance into the program may be partially based on interviews with the applicants. ***There is no cost to the participant for this program.***

I understand and agree to the above requirements. This permission slip also authorizes a licensed physician or other medical staff to carry out emergency medical care deemed necessary for my child if I cannot be reached. *The supervising teacher will bring this form to each session.*
