Magnet schools are public schools of choice, so named because they “attract” students to their particular focus or theme. These tuition-free schools give parents and guardians the opportunity to choose quality programs for their children from throughout the greater Hartford area. Enrollment in our magnet schools is determined by a lottery.

The Charter School for Young Children

on Asylum Hill: This socially and economically integrated school focuses on the development of the whole child. It serves urban and suburban children from three years through grade 2 and has an emphasis on literacy. The program is designed to meet the needs of young children and provide support and resources for family. Before and after school care is provided for a fee.

International Magnet School for Global Citizenship:

The goal of this program is to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people who can help create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect. Students are encouraged to become active, compassionate, and lifelong learners. The school provides programs for preschool to grade 2 students, with before and after school care provided for a fee.

Reggio Magnet School of the Arts: This program for preschool to grade 2 students focuses on giving children some control over the direction of their learning, teaching children through experiences, working with other children and material items, and providing opportunities for self-expression. Before and after school care is provided for a fee.

East Hartford-Glastonbury Elementary

Magnet School: This school, which serves children from kindergarten to grade 5, offers a program that focuses on science, technology, and global studies. The curriculum integrates language arts and mathematics and features an inquiry-based approach to instruction designed to stimulate high-level learning.

Montessori Magnet: This internationally recognized magnet school is built upon a pioneering educational concept that features a traditional Montessori education for students ages 3 to 12, extended child care for students participating in the full-day program, and a modern, custom-built facility.

University of Hartford Magnet School: Located on the University of Hartford campus, this school serves students from preschool to grade 5 with a focus on linguistic and logical/mathematical intelligence, as well as visual/spatial, bodily/kinesthetic, musical, naturalist, interpersonal, and intrapersonal intelligences.

Two Rivers Magnet Middle School: This school for students in grades 6 through 8 focuses on environmental science, using state-of-the-art technology. The school’s unique location on the banks of the Connecticut and Hockanum rivers in East Hartford provides a living laboratory for hands-on scientific experiments and an opportunity for students to learn about the geology, chemistry, physics, and history of the region.

Metropolitan Learning Center: This school, which serves students in grades 6 through 12, offers global and international themes with an emphasis on interdisciplinary global understanding. Opportunities for international travel exist at all grade levels and the school offers a range of Advanced Placement courses. The Metropolitan Learning Center has been repeatedly named a School of Distinction by Magnet Schools of America.

CREC Public Safety Academy: The Academy’s goal is to provide an innovative learning environment that helps students in grades 6 through 12 develop the values, self-discipline, and academic and life skills needed to achieve success in college or in the career of their choice. The Academy also provides an opportunity for students in grades 11 and 12 to take tuition-free college courses.

The Greater Hartford Academy of the Arts: This school for grades 9 through 12 provides both a full-day and half-day program of college preparatory arts training in a highly challenging environment of professional artists and arts educators. Courses of study include creative writing, dance, instrumental/vocal music, visual arts, theater/musical theater, and technical theater.

The Greater Hartford Academy of Mathematics and Science:

This school offers both a full day program for grades 7 through 12 and half-day program for grades 9 to 12 that focuses on science, math, and technology, with an emphasis on inquiry-based research programs. Students benefit from studying with professional scientists, engineers, and mathematicians in college preparatory courses.

Great Path Academy: Located in a new, state-of-the-art building on the campus of the Manchester Community College, the Academy offers students in grades 10 through 12 excellent academic programs in an innovative learning environment to help them develop the values, self-discipline, work habits, and academic and life skills needed to achieve success. Students are immersed in the college community and encouraged to accelerate their postsecondary studies by taking tuition-free college courses at Manchester Community College.

CREC Medical Professions and Teacher

Preparation Academy: The CREC Medical Professions and Teacher Preparation Academy for grades 9 through 12 was developed through a partnership between CREC, Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center, and the University of Hartford. Students can focus on either the medical professions or teacher preparation theme. They have the unique opportunity to work closely with medical professionals in health care facilities or with pre-K to grade 12 teachers in public schools. In addition, eligible students may take tuition-free college courses at the University of Hartford.
