

Residential Program

In the summer of 2003 an intensive four week residential program will be offered to high school students to introduce them to the teaching profession, to develop knowledge and skills, and to further their education and career goals.

For the seventh successive year, university professors and public school teachers will conduct this successful program on the campus of Eastern Connecticut State University for a diverse group of students who show promise and motivation to pursue a teaching career. Students who will be juniors or seniors in the fall of 2003 are eligible.



Teaching in the Twenty-First Century

College credit will be granted for a course created for the Summer Institute, "Teaching in the Twenty-first Century: An Overview". The course will grant three university credits for the study of:

- educational theory
- field experience
- educational technology

The theory component will be coordinated with field experience. Individual academic goals will include work in one or more chosen content areas. The program will also offer guidance in preparing for college and career.



A Range of Field Experience

Most experiences will be characterized by a high degree of interaction and hands-on practice.

Students will participate in interactive field experiences with youngsters who represent a range of ages, ability, and cultural and linguistic backgrounds drawn from:

- Early Childhood Study Center on ECSU campus
- Windham-area summer schools
- Windham Middle School summer program
